COURSE OBJECTIVES:

This course is specifically designed to assist students in understanding the importance of the Code of Criminal Procedure which is one of the essential acts in India as well as the primary legislation on the procedure for administering criminal justice. The course is aimed at driving home the students how the pre-trial, trial and the subsequent process are geared up to make the administration of criminal justice effective. The course will acquaint the student with organization of the functionaries under the Code, their power and functions at various stages and the procedure according to which these powers and functions are to be exercised The

substantive law has to be applied through the uniform procedure as laid down which will be undertaken on completion of the course. The students will also understand the reason and manner of administering the punishments for any given offence under the substantive Penal Laws. The course will help in understanding the machinery for the investigation of crime, apprehension of suspected criminals, collection of evidence, determination of guilt or innocence of the accused person, and the determination of punishment of the guilty. The objective is also to sensitize the students about critical issues in administration of criminal justice like protection of human rights of victims and the principles of fair trial. The students will also undertake the study of two cognate Acts as a part of this course viz; Juvenile Justice Act (care and Protection of Children) 2015 and Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act.

Course Outcome:

1. Adapt the procedure of examination of witnesses and different categories of Witnesses involved in proceeding.

2. Identify a lawyer's professional obligations at each stage in the life cycle of a lawsuit

3. Apply the standard and uniform procedure to deal with the criminal matters in issue.

4. Apply the rules relating to the procedure of issuance of summons, arrest and impounding of documents and conducting criminal trial in courts.

5. Analyse the Criminal Court procedures to be followed in India.
